Teentech 2017, a day of hands-on technology and workshops for girls in 9th-11th grades, will be held on Tuesday, May 23 at Stockton University. More than 280 girls from 20 schools are registered. With 20 sessions to choose from we expect to have a great time in classes of 14-15 girls each. Only Ocean City High School will be attending from Cape May County. Lower Township applied but it was after Teentech was filled to capacity.

We need about 20 volunteers to lead the girls to their workshops as well as help them with their bracelets and evaluation forms. You will be able to select workshops of your choice as well as enjoy lunch with the group. There will be a meeting at Stockton on May 15 at 2pm for

Tech Trek is a week-long overnight STEM camp for girls entering 8th grade which is being held at Stockton University for the third year. The first year 30 girls from Atlantic and Cape May Counties attended. The second year 60 girls attended from throughout New Jersey. This year we expect 60 girls from throughout the state. Statewide 145 girls were nominated and 115 of those followed through with applications. Slots are available to counties based on the number of applications received from that county. Cape May had 3 applications and we were allocated 2 slots with our third candidate placed on the wait list. Applicants have been notified of their stats.

The "Meet and Greet" for those accepted will be held at Stockton on Saturday, May 13 from 1-4pm. Professional Women's Night will be on Thursday night, July 20 and we are looking for AAUW members to moderate the small meetings of Professional Women and campers. **Tween Tech** (girls 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> grade) was held at Stockton University on January 6 and Drew University on January 13. Despite the snowy weather, 230 girls attended Stockton on January 6 and each participated in 2 of the 20 workshops offered. Following the workshops, the students, their teachers, the workshop presenters and volunteers enjoyed lunch.

**Teentech** (girls 9<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> grade) will be held at Stockton University on May 23. It will also be held at Ramapo College in Mahwah, NJ on May 22.

Tech Trek (girls entering 8th grade) will be held at Stockton University from July 16 through 22. Professional Women's Night will be on Thursday, July 20.

## Tech Trek - a program of AAUW

### Volunteer for Tech Trek New Jersey 2017!

Volunteering with Tech Trek is a great way to get involved in helping 8th grade girls discover their potential in STEM. Tech Trek is staffed almost entirely by volunteers, and couldn't be done without volunteer efforts. All overnight volunteers receive reimbursement for obtaining required clearance, complimentary room and board on campus, and a modest stipend.

**Dorm Monitors** are responsible for a small group of Tech Trek campers, provide emotional support, and respond to campers' questions and concerns for 2-3 day shifts throughout the week.

Each Dorm Monitor will have a "dorm group" Of seven to ten girls. Dorm Monitors will hold daily meetings with their dorm groups and keep track of their whereabouts throughout the day. They will accompany girls to campus activities and field trips and will be in charge of the enforcement of camp rules and policies. Dorm Monitors will rotate throughout the camp and pass along updates to their replacements for each shift.

If you are not renewing for any reason, we will be sorry to lose you. Just let me know and I'll take you off the reminder list.


#### FOR DUAL MEMBERSHIP TO ANOTHER CHAPTER



### FROM OUR ATLANTIC COUNTY AAUW BRANCH FRIENDS



The Atlantic County AAUW branch is planning a bus trip to **New York City** on December 16, 2017 to see the Broadway show *Wicked*, which is the story of the friendship between two strong women who are very different from each other. The music is beautiful, the effects are breathtaking, and, even if you have seen it at another location, you will enjoy it in New York. Each time you see it, you will discover new aspects of the plot. It opens many doors for discussion among women.

We have reserved 50 seats in the rear orchestra (stadium seating) with the understanding that we may need wheelchair seating and will require handicapped access to elevators. The theater said that they would recommend a wheelchair over a walker. The bus should drop us and pick us up at the front of the theater and take us to dinner. The bus and group-priced tickets will cost a total of \$145. We will have dinner together at individual cost. Each member may register a spouse or friend to accompany them. If initial seats fill, we must fill an entire second bus and be able to get 50 more tickets to take additional people.

We should leave around 10AM and arrive home at about 10:00 or 11:00PM that night.

Please respond with a "yes" or "no" immediately. We will need a firm count by <u>April 25, 2017</u> and the payment will be due by check on <u>May 22, 2017</u>. Deposits will have to be paid to the bus company and Broadway ticketing agency at that time to hold the bus and the seats for a popular time of the year for shows and travel. We will deposit the remaining funds in the AAUW account. The branch will not make any expenditures. All costs will be paid by the individuals attending.
