Freeholder Hayes spoke about her journey as a shy student who began her education at Atlantic Cape Community College to her present job and life. She is a retired Captain of Detectives for the Cape May County Prosecutor's Office, FBI National Academy graduate, Atlantic Cape Community College alumna and adjunct professor. Her family, including her granddaughters, were in attendance.

The event was also a fundraiser for the WOW League tuition assistance program for at risk youth attending ACCC. WOW assistance has provided 25 academically promising Cape Educational COMPACT High School students the opportunity to experience college. The principal spoke about the value of this program for our community. Three students, some presently in the program, and some recent graduates now college students, related their experiences at the school.

WOMEN'S LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE BREAKFAST on March 12 By Mona Moore

SOMERS POINT – New Jersey Lieutenant Governor Kim Guadagno was the guest speaker Saturday, March 12, at a Women's Leadership Conference breakfast at Greate Bay Country Club sponsored by the Cape May County Advisory Commission on the Status of Women.

Hosted by Cape May County Freeholder E. Marie Hayes and the County Freeholder Board, the Women's History Month event was a fund-raiser for the Atlantic and Cape May County chapters of the American Association of University Women. The funds will go toward the group's one day teentech program for 9th through 11th grade girls to be held in June at Atlantic Cape Community College in Mays Landing and a weeklong Tech Trek Camp for eighth-grade girls in July at Stockton University.

Guadagno, who was the first female sheriff of Monmouth County, emphasized the importance of getting girls involved in (STEM) science, technology, engineering and math areas where women are under-represented. "Our job is to show people you can do things, despite the fact that you are a girl," she said. "When you get a chance to do something nobody thinks you can do, you do it."

She pointed out that at the NJ Institute of Technology only 25 percent of students are female, although technology and engineering jobs are among the highest paid in the country.

"We have to do better," she said. "We need to grab those girls, and tell them there is a path forward for them. We have to get them in kindergarten through eighth grades. If we wait till high school, it's too late. We have to reach and grab them as we rise, so they rise, too."
