Tween Tech 2018 (girls 6th to 8th grade) was scheduled for January 5 at Stockton University. Unfortunately, a severe winter storm forced cancellation.

Teentech (girls 9th-11th grade) will be held on Wednesday, May 23 from 8:30am to 2:30pm at Atlantic Cape Community College on the Mays Landing campus. We can accommodate 120 girls from Atlantic and Cape May counties. To date 9 schools have signed up (Absegami, Atlantic Institute of Technology, Cedar Creek, Egg Harbor Township, Holy Spirit, Lower Cape May Regional High School, Oakcrest and Ocean City High School). We have 16 AAUW volunteers signed up and still need 4-5 more volunteers to staff the Registration Desk and to guide the girls to their Workshops. If you would like to volunteer please contact Dottie at dpearson@atlantic.edu or pearson@princeton.edu. Volunteers will meet on Monday, May 21, at 11am to locate their rooms and to learn what they will be doing.

Tech Trek will be held at Stockton University from Sunday, July 15 through Saturday July 21. Ten girls were nominated from Cape May County Schools (Avalon, Cape Trinity Catholic, Crest Memorial, Dennis Township, Lower Township, Margaret Mace, Middle Township, Ocean City, Wildwood and Woodbine). All ten girls followed through with applications and interviews. Interviewers were Connie Blocher, Kathy Ghanavati, Marion Ingram, Dottie Pearson, Suzanne Pelkaus, Mary Jane Slugg and Karen Weis. We will submit our recommendations to the state selection committee. We were allocated 5 slots and the girls and their families were notified of their status toward the end of April. Marion Ingram, Ann Marchesani and Randi Ziring are chairing the Fund Raising Committee and are writing grant proposals. We have a \$2000 shortfall and we will need funding to commit to holding Tech Trek in 2019. Evelyn Lovitz is working on securing volunteers, supply lists and field trips. Contact Evelyn if you'd like to volunteer for a day or as a Dorm Mom or just a visit (but let her know you are coming).

The **Meet and Greet** will be at Stockton University in the campus center from 1 to 3pm on Saturday, May 12. You are invited to attend and welcome our new group of campers.

On April 25 Governor Murphy signed New Jersey's Diane Allen Equal Pay Bill, that was vetoed by Governor Christie giving New Jersey one of the most comprehensive laws in the country. It increases the length of time claimants can receive back pay to six years and triples the damages.

AAUW plans to train 10 million women to negotiate their financial futures by 2022, through their Start Smart program, and Work Smart program. ACCC had participated in Start Smart for students starting out their careers, Work Smart is for women who are negotiating for a raise, promotion or a new job.

As per the website, salary.aauw.org, to date this is not available in New Jersey. They are calling for volunteers to start a workshop. AAUW is collaborating with LUNA, a women's nutrition bar, to roll out an on-line course by the fall of 2018. It is called "It's Negotiable" and can be accessed at salary.aauw.org


