



March 28 at 1:30pm: Tour of the Cold Spring Brewery with presentations on building and brewery process. Open to friends and family.

April 27, departure time to be announced: Tour of Bowman Hill Wildflower Reserve located in New Hope, Bucks County, Pennsylvania in the Pidcock Creek Valley.

The Preserve contains over 700 native plants on 134 acres. There are 4 and 1/2 miles of trails. The Preserve was created in the 1930's in part by vision of Mary K. Parry who was then Chairman of the Bucks County Federation of Women's Clubs. The Parry trail which is a beautiful trail of Bluebells is named for her. The guided two hour tour will include walking on trails that are mostly easy walking on mulch but are not meant for wheelchairs though visitor center and few concrete trails are available. Lunch will be arranged by reservation at Bowman Hill Tavern which is nearby. Two car pools have been arranged with space for 3 people in each car. If more people are interested in going we ask for additional drivers. Reservations are necessary. Please contact Chris Dewaghe (who has arranged this outing) or Karen Weis if you are interested.
