Stockton University to offer a "Steminist"
summer program for 34 high school girls
throughout the State who were alumni of
2018 and 2019 Tech Trek camps, and the
2021 virtual Tech Trek event. The program
ran in two stages, Sun-Wed and Wed-Sat,
each session fully booked with science
workshops and fun activities.

Sporting STEMINIST t-shirts, attendees were engaged all day, every day with chemistry and biomedical labs, robotics, physics, polyhedron origami, interview role play, e-sports and on-campus trips to observe the stars through a telescope, maple trees and syrup evaporator, and sustainable farming fields.

The hard work and long hours of the Tech Trek Leadership Team were instrumental to the success of the camp: Ann Marchesani, Linda Harmon and Gail Davis from Atlantic County AAUW, and Stockton University's Dean of Education, Claudine Keenan, as well as AAUW volunteers from Atlantic, Camden, Cape May and Salem counties who supported the event.

The Tech Trek program is strongly aligned with the AAUW mission to provide girls with opportunities to become aware of possibilities not previously imagined. As one camper who had attended Tech Trek in 7th Grade said: "Tech Trek changed my life."


Thursday, September 22, 2022 at 12:00 noon

BOOK NOOK

Greetings Fellow Readers,

Welcome back! The summer went quickly for me with visits from our kids and grandkids and reading, reading, reading. A highlight of our summer was receiving our 2020 Christmas present from our kids! They had given us a coupon for a make-over for our computer room/library and walk-in closet. Then Covid hit and all was put on hold. They took up ratty carpeting and installed beautiful laminate flooring. We cleaned off the book cases which

were packed three deep in places. My daughter, the librarian, was ruthless as we sorted the books. If I hesitated about why I needed to keep a book, it was quickly bagged! We donated twenty-two shopping bags full of books. Half went to the AmVets Thrift Shop in Villas and half to the Habitat for Humanity Thrift Shop in CMCH.

I did a lot of reading this summer. I caught up on several Alex Delaware books by Jonathan Kellerman. I also read several Jack Reacher books by Lee Child. What Happened to the Bennetts?, Lisa Scottoline's newest book, was very interesting. I learned about how the Witness Protection Program works as well as enjoying the story. Right now I'm about halfway through the most recent Outlander book by Diana Gabaldon. If you aren't familiar with it, you can catch some of the story on TV. My daughter says it's pretty true to the books but I haven't watched any episodes.

There are nine books so far and, according to the author, there are more to come. The books are packed with lots of characters, action, adventure, romance, American and Scottish history, and a bit of time travel. The first book was published in 1991. We meet the main characters

although they haven't met each other. Jamie Fraser is involved in the Jacobite Rising in Scotland in 1743. Claire Randel, a married woman and a WW II nurse, is visiting Scotland in 1945 when she is transported back in time to 1743. She meets Jamie, they fall in love, and the rest is a life of mind-boggling experiences. This series tells a rollicking good story!

I have already read the four books we've chosen for September and October and enjoyed all of them. The stories are all very different but are all well-written and well-researched. I'm looking forward to all of the discussions as well as seeing you all again. We will be back at Mulligan's in September for the Evening Group. The Daytime Group can't start at Crest Pier until October. Therefore, we will have our September meeting at Castaway Cafe in Villas as noted in the Newsletter. On June 24th of this year, AAUW issued a press release in response to the Supreme Court's opinion in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization. The announcement read in part:

"AAUW believes everyone has the right to make decisions about their own reproductive lives without government interference. Abortion access is vital to women's ability to control their lives, bodies and futures. Without reproductive freedom, there can be no equity.

Being able to choose whether and when to become a parent improves women's well-being and fosters economic security—a crucial component of AAUW's mission. This is particularly important in a country that lacks accessible maternal health care, paid caregiving leave and workplace protections for pregnant workers."
